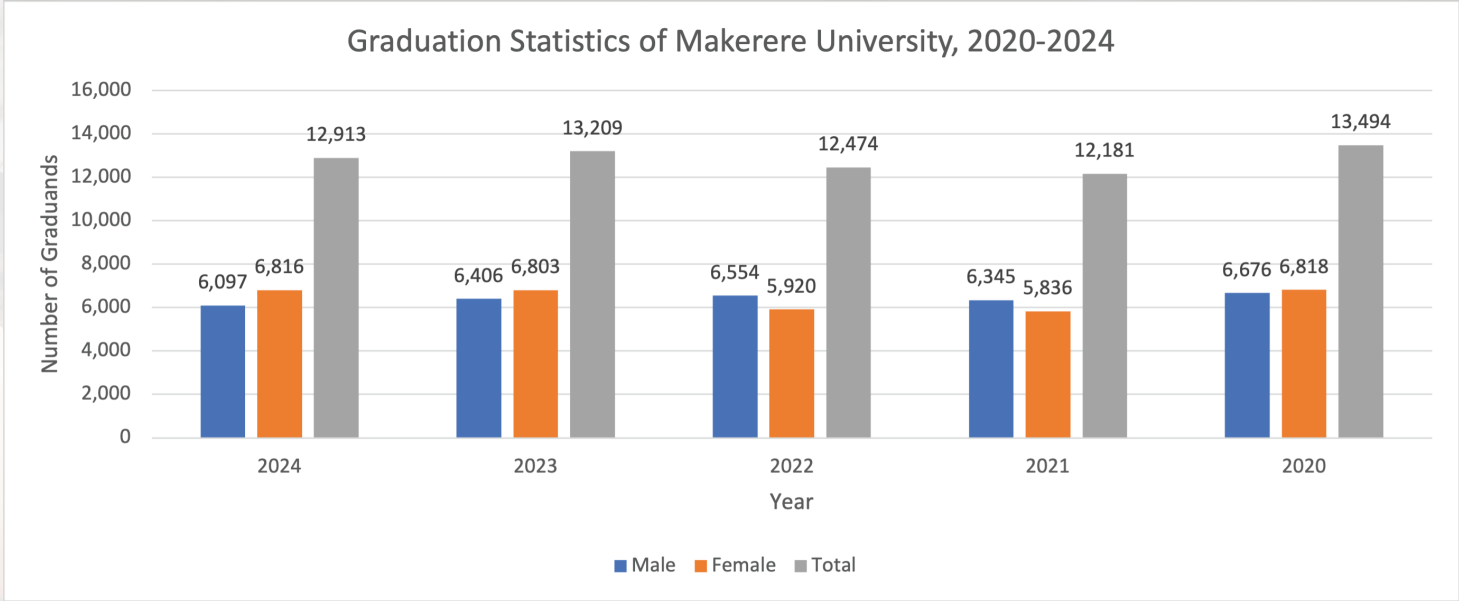

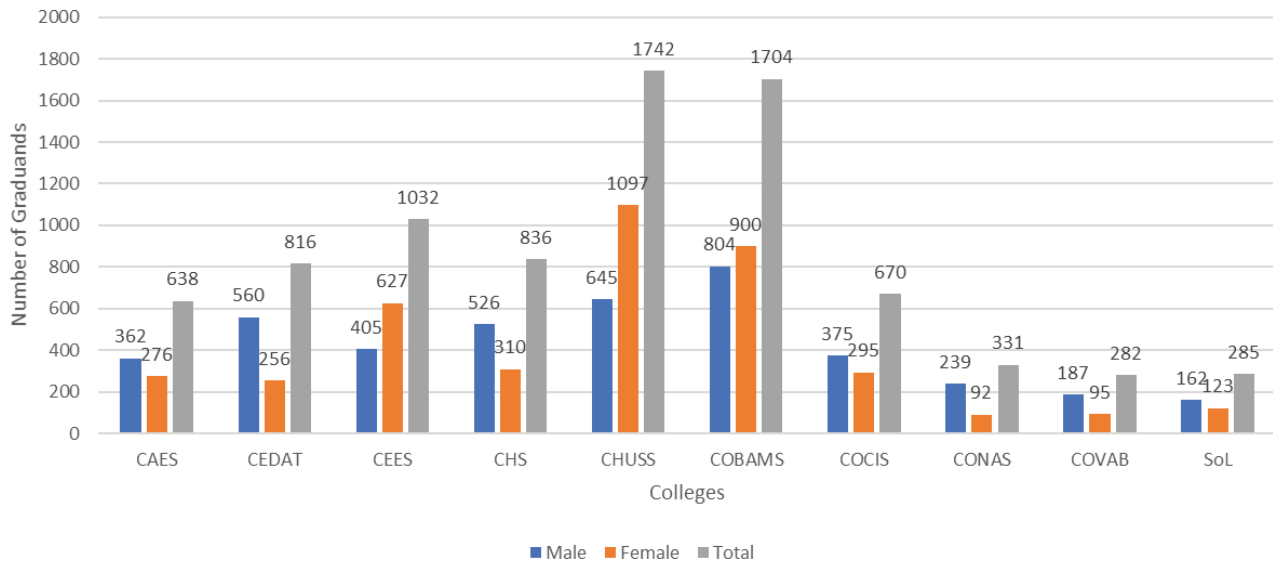

Number of Graduands by College and Gender, February 2024

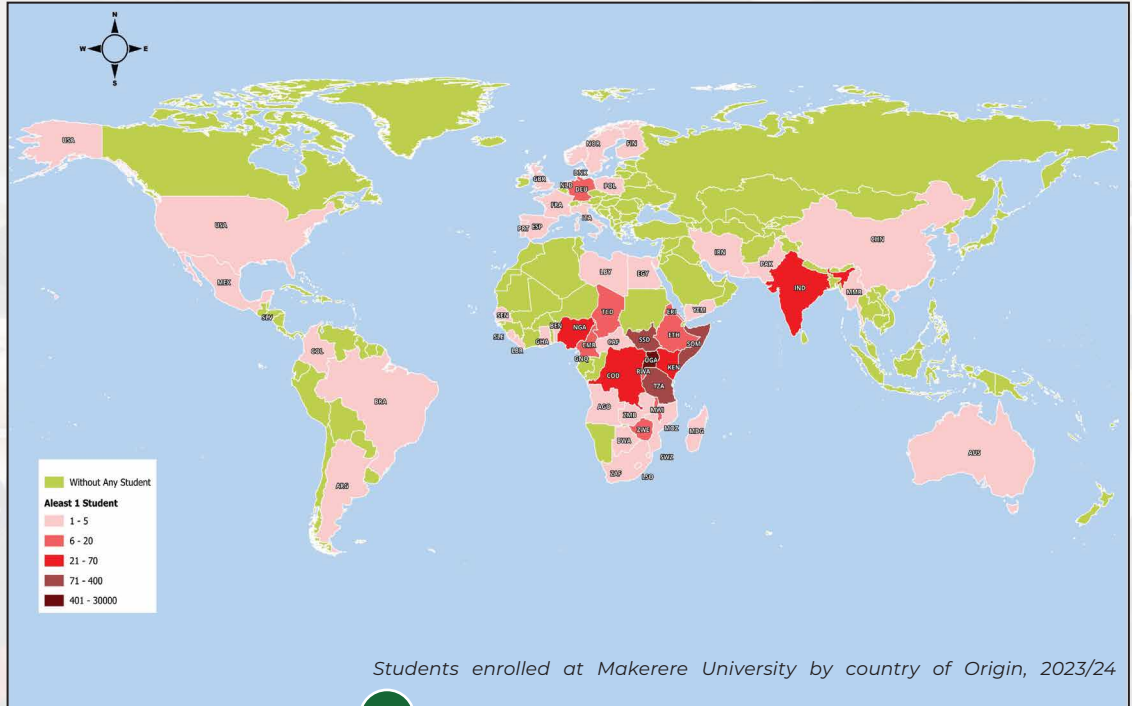




Nationality of Students at Makerere University, 2023/24

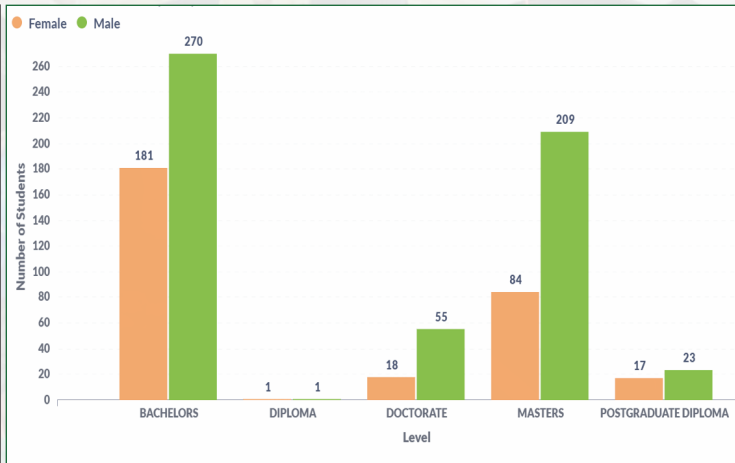
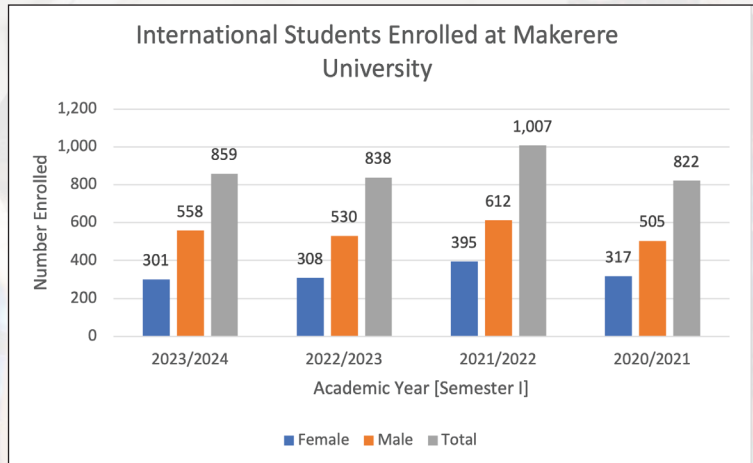


International students Enrollment at Makerere University

Enrollments International Study by Gender on figure key below



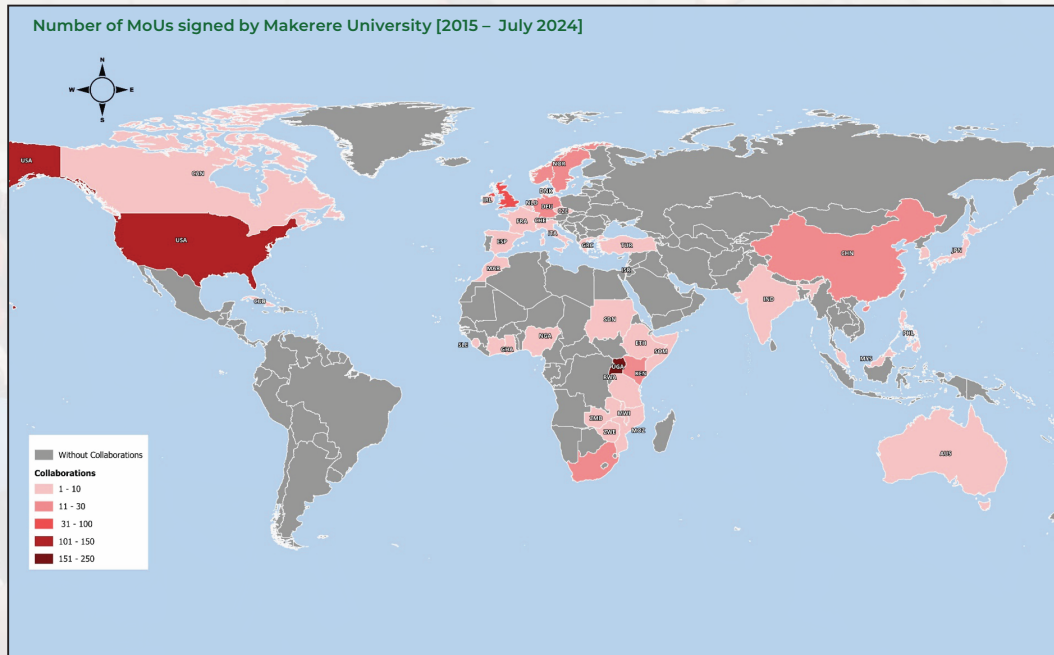

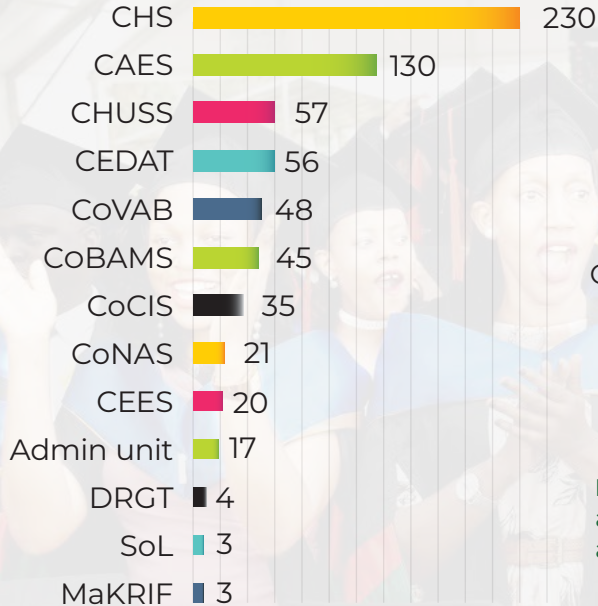
International Partnerships

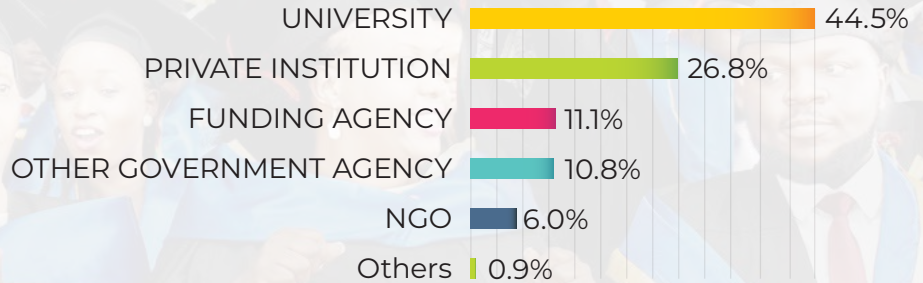

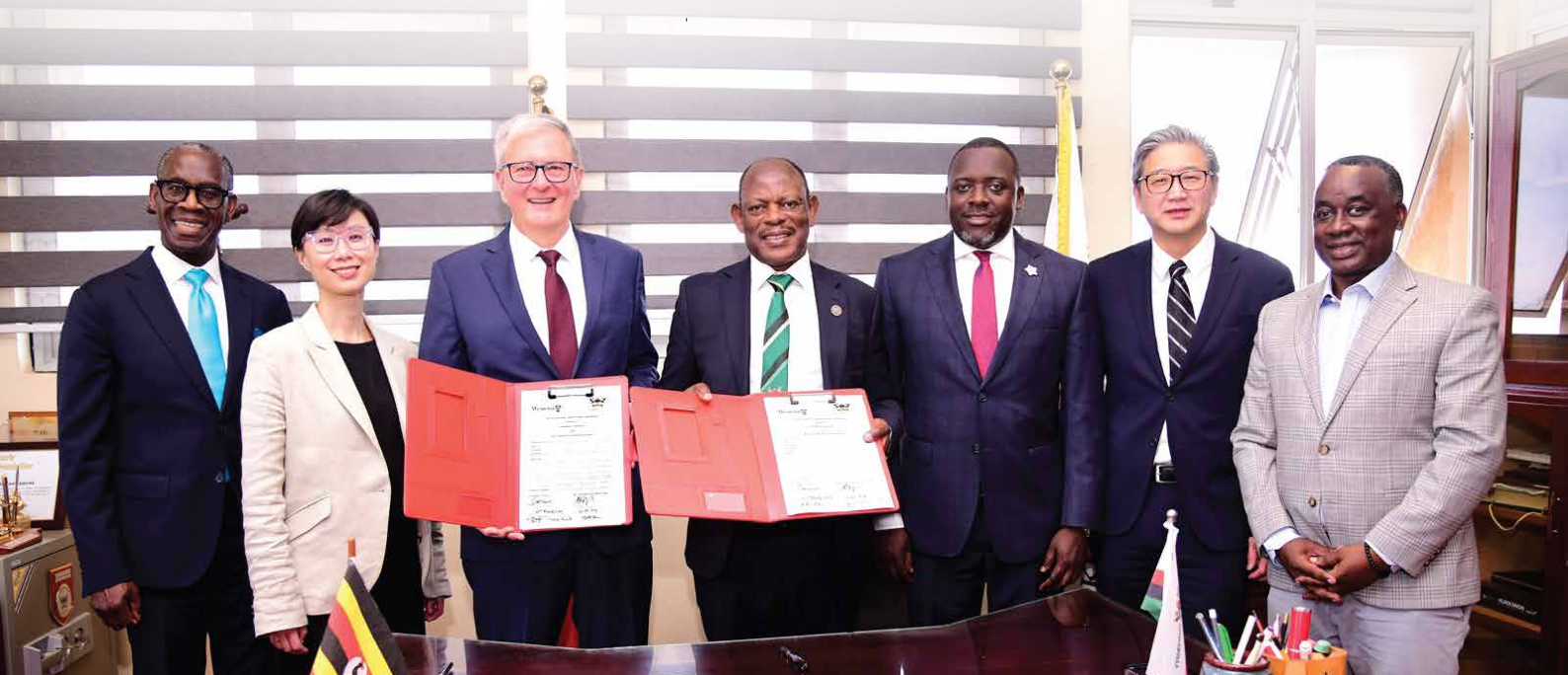
MOU BY UNIT (n = 669)

5. Global Health.



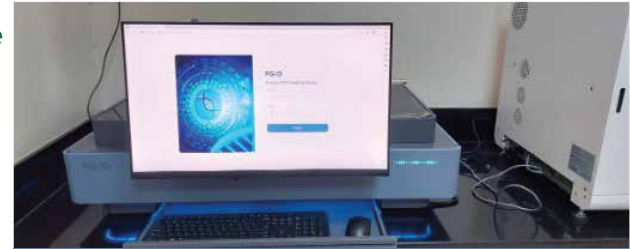

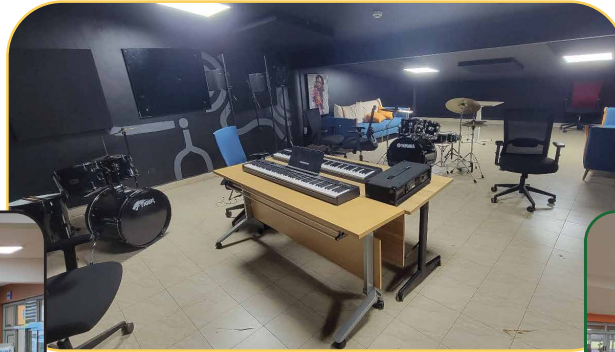

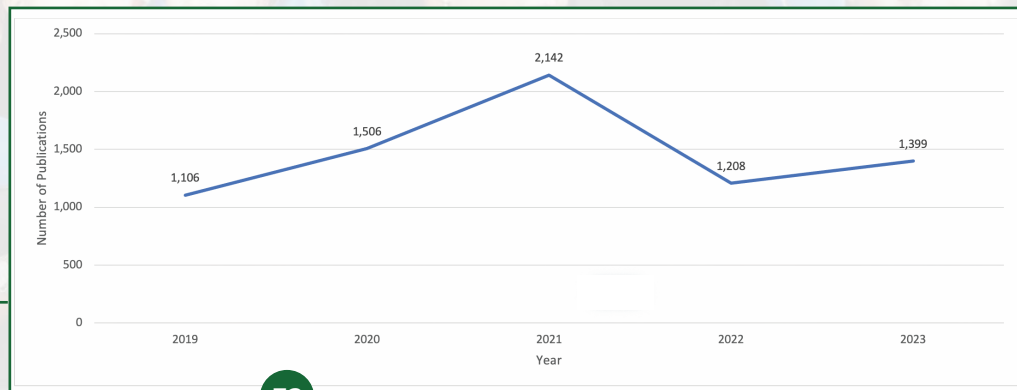

Library Resources

The Makerere University Library, which started from a small Tutor's Library in 1949, grew to become one of the biggest and best Libraries in Uganda and Africa. It has a seating capacity of over 4,000 users. It acts as a National Reference Library, Legal and United Nations Deposit Centre



The library collection consists of:

over 35,968 electronic books accessible through MYLOFT (My Library on Finger Tips) remote access system

299,841 titles (481, 413 copies) of print monographs, and 11,395 print journals that are accessible through an online catalogue referred to as MAKULA.

An institutional Repository where staff and students' research output are maintained. This has improved the institution's online visibility

Students with Special Needs

All people have disabilities; however, there are those who have more pronounced disabilities. Makerere University admits students with special needs and/or disabilities under government sponsorship. All candidates including those with disability meet the minimum requirements for admission into the University. The University enrolls the highest number of students with disabilities out of the 64 slots allocated to all Public universities in Uganda. Library Services for Users with Disabilities/ Special needs

1.Fusion Camera: Takes a snapshot of the printed material and converts it into digital form in real time

2.Braille Keyboard: Assistive technology which allows blind or visually impaired library users to do common tasks such as writing and browsing the Internet.

3.Pearl Reading Scanner: Used by library users who are partially blind/very short sighted.

4.Braille Embosser: It prints braille output from a computer by punching dots onto paper and this makes written documents readable by the blind

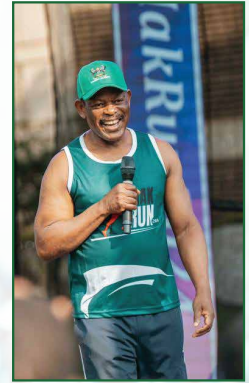

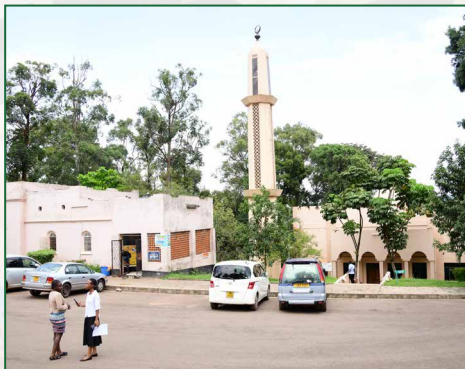
MaK-RUN

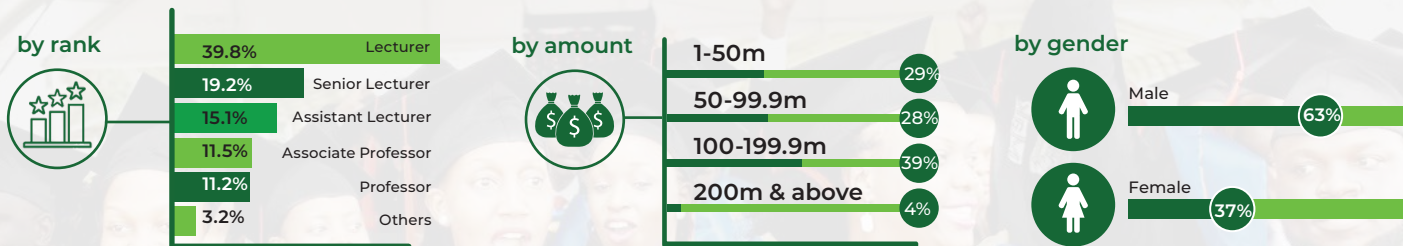

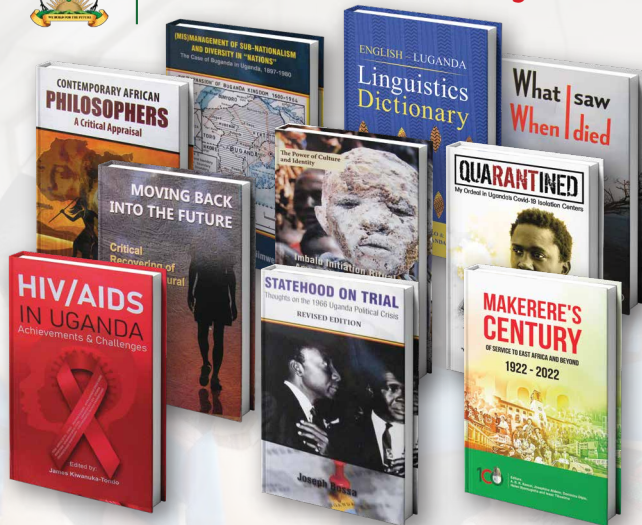

The Makerere University Main Building, also known as the Ivory Tower, is a historic and iconic structure at one of Africa's oldest and most prestigious universities. The Main Building, constructed in 1941, has been a central part of Makerere University's identity. It housed the University's administration and was a symbol of academic excellence. On September 19th, 2020 a devastating fire severely damaged this landmark, sparking a concerted effort to rebuild and restore the building to its former glory.
