





GRADUATION STATISTICS OF MAKERERE UNIVERSITY 2024 BY GENDER






Nationality of Students at Makerere University, 2023/24





International students Enrollment at Makerere University

Enrollments International Study by Gender on figure key below











1.Fusion Camera: Takes a snapshot of the printed material and converts it into digital form in real time

2.Braille Keyboard: Assistive technology which allows blind or visually impaired library users to do common tasks such as writing and browsing the Internet.

3.Pearl Reading Scanner: Used by library users who are partially blind/very short sighted.

4.Braille Embosser: It prints braille output from a computer by punching dots onto paper and this makes written documents readable by the blind



On September 19th, 2020 a devastating fire severely damaged this landmark, sparking a concerted effort to rebuild and restore the building to its former glory.
